# I . Japanese contribution to the e-ASIA JRP

## < Basic ideas on contribution of the Members >

Board Meeting/ Advisory Council	Hosting country <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>–Expenses for the venue</li><li>–Lunch/Reception and drinks</li><li>–Other local costs</li></ul> Other countries <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>–Travel cost, hotel accommodation, and perdiem for their participants</li></ul>

## Japanese contribution to the e-ASIA JRP (cntd.)

< Before setup and stable operation of the program,  
Japan will contribute as follows: >

Board Meeting/ Advisory Council	Hosting cost –Expenses for the venue –Lunch/Reception and drinks –Other local costs  Costs for participants –Travel cost, hotel accommodation, and perdiem for their participants
Up to 1 person for each country	
Preliminary Secretariat	Hosting cost –Office costs –Utility costs (water, electricity, etc.)  Others –Secretariat member (including salary) –PC and facilities

## Japanese contribution to the e-ASIA JRP (cntd.)

### <In-kind contributions>

Before setup of the secretariat, Japan will provide secretariat functions as follows:

- ❑ Arrangement for the Board Meeting, Advisory Council and Peer Review Panel (venue, hotel, reception, etc.)
- ❑ Arrangement for workshops (planning, venue, hotel, reception, site visit, etc.)

Japan will also provide necessary coordination/arrangements to utilize Japanese large research facilities such as Spring-8.

## Japanese contribution to the e-ASIA JRP (cntd.)

<In-kind contributions related to IPR issues>

JST could provide following supports in relation to IPR through JST's 'Center for Intellectual Property Strategies',  
when Japanese researchers take part in joint projects;

- ❑ Support for PCT application of IP derived from joint projects to Japan Patent Office (financial support will not be included).
- ❑ Introducing patents in JST's research result database (J-STORE, etc.) and 'New Technology Fair' held a dozen of times a year.
- ❑ Advice for making patent group (group of related patents with a core patent).
